2005 AAP Section on Allergy and Immunology Outstanding Pediatric Abstract Awards for Fellows-in-Training and Junior Faculty.

Application process completed

The Section on Allergy and Immunology of the American Academy of Pediatrics, in collaboration with the American Academy of Allergy Asthma and Immunology, is pleased to announce the 2005 AAP Section on Allergy and Immunology Outstanding Pediatric Abstract Awards for Fellows-in-Training and Junior Faculty.

This program will provide a \$750 award for each of the three best abstracts involving pediatric patients (birth to 21 years) submitted by a fellow-in-training and accepted for presentation at the 2005 Annual Meeting in San Antonio Texas, March 18-22, 2005.

This program will also award a \$1,000 award for each of the two best abstracts involving pediatric patients (birth to 21 years) submitted by a junior faculty member and accepted for presentation at the same meeting.

In addition, all awardees will receive reimbursed membership dues for the AAP and its Section on Allergy and Immunology for one year.

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

- 1) Fellow-in-Training in an accredited allergy/immunology training program in the United States and Canada who is first author on a submitted abstract and has conducted the majority of the abstract related work **OR**
- 2) A faculty member of an accredited allergy/immunology training program in the United States or Canada, who completed allergy/immunology training less then 6 years ago, who is first author on a submitted abstract and has conducted the majority of the abstract related work.
- 3) The Fellow-in-Training must be eligible for or board certified in Pediatrics; the faculty member must be board certified in pediatrics.
- 4) The abstract must describe new and/or important research findings from original basic science or clinical research conducted in pediatric allergy and/or immunology.
- 5) The abstract is submitted on line according to AAAAI policies and procedures by September 19, 2004.
