Using quick-relief medications more than

2 DAYS PER WEEK is considered overuse

and may indicate inadequate asthma control and the need to initiate or intensify anti-inflammatory medications.

Less than half of people with asthma reported being taught how to avoid triggers. Almost half (48%) of adults who were taught how to avoid those triggers did not follow this advice.
