Science and technology

- Telemedicine transforming traditional view of medicine
- Mobile technology untethers healthcare and enables the practice of care anywhere
- · DTC market for genetic testing will expand
- Activist disease foundations upending the way scientific research is done and the way academics interact with pharmaceutical and biotech companies
 - Demands accountability and information sharing almost unheard of in broad scientific community

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Mobile technology

- · Reduces need for hospital admissions and physician office visits
- Improves access
 - Remote patients
 - Creates schedule availability
 - 40% of physicians say could eliminate 11% to 30% of office visits thru use*
- Contrary to payment mechanisms
 - Why accept technology that hurts incomes?
- · Provides access to more accurate data at decision-making point of care

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Apps to help educate patients

- DrawMD (free in Apple app store) physicians can sketch, stamp or type on detailed anatomic images and then save to EHRs and/or share images with patients
- NumeraNET (free in Apple app store) patients can share info such as weight, blood pressure, pedometer results with physicians, who can send the info to an FHR
- Survey on the Spot (free in Apple app store)
 - Gather instant feedback on your practice with custom surveys
 - See compiled survey results in your account
 - Get software alerts when a patient rates service as poor



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



Consumers demand portal services • Patients want improved communication • 79+% of patients have internet access • % of patients wanting the following services: ○ 77% Ask questions where no visit is necessary ○ 71% Fix appointments ○ 71% Get new prescriptions for medications they take ○ 70% Receive the results of medical tests ○ 6% None of the above ○ 4% Don't know 55% indicated the ability to communicate with their doctors in the above manner would influence their choice of health plans.

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Patient portal increases efficiency • The patient self-registers saving staff data entry • The patient's past medical, social, family history can be captured in the portal and "accepted" or imported into the PM/EHR – More accurate and comprehensive – Saves the patient time in the practice setting – Saves nursing time



QR - - Quick Response codes Scan the QR (like bar codes) using smartphone camera to access data that links to web page Add QR code to patient statements that link to your payment page online Free QR code generation: - Qrstuff.com - Zxing.appspot.com/generator - Quikqr.com - Create the code, print it, and it's ready!



Kiosk check-in cost-benefit

- Range of costs: free to ...
 - \$2,000-\$5,000 per tablet/kiosk
 - \$3,000-\$5,000 installation, training, setup
 - \$2,000-\$10,000 integration services
 - \$250-\$400 monthly fee (updates insurance info)
- Benefits beyond reduced paper:
 - Reduced denials
 - Better performers: 3% of claims denied on first submission (others 5%)
 - \$11,520 costs recovered annually
 - 30 claims/day, 4 days/wk, 48 wks/year, \$40/claim to rework

- Smarter RCM
 - Leverage clinical workflow
 - Billing is a by-product
- Population Health
 - Manage patients more effectively
 - Collaborate with PCMHs
- Business intelligence/Meta Data

- Heavy encryption
- Master password reboot, sleep mode, inactive time
- Creates passwords random character generator
- Inserts a toolbar into your browser
- \$29.95 (free version for up to 10 passwords)



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"All or Nothing" is a Losing Proposition

- Accept the incremental benefits
- Waiting for the "next upgrade" or the "next release" delays *all* benefits realizations
- Transferring 30% of incoming phone calls to web communications is better than 0%

Changing reimbursement

- More aggressive billing and collection tactics
 - Refer to collection sooner (than 180 days)
 - Request payment for out-of-pocket costs in advance of services
- Revenue growth
 - Not from increased negotiated rates
 - From incentives tied to outcomes, patient satisfaction and cost reductions
